The Memorial Garden

Keene Valley Congregational Church 1791 NYS Route 73 Keene Valley, New York



The Memorial Garden is located directly behind the church in the alcove between the Sanctuary and the Nursery. This garden is an area of beauty and tranquility; a sacred place of peace and serenity. It was created as a dignified and mindful place to memorialize the members and the friends of Keene Valley Congregational Church, and as a quiet place for individuals to go for meditation and prayer.

History

During the early 1900's a flower garden was established behind the church and there was no path from what is now the church parking lot over to the ADK Nature Conservancy.

In the late 1920's The Rev. Walter Lowrie, great uncle of Andrew Derr, gave the church the Italian Dolomite wayside shrine.

In 2012-2013, as the result of growing interest, a task force was gathered and The Memorial Garden was created.

Bernard Webb drew up plans for the garden; Heather Coffin of East Branch Organics oversaw the plantings and path work; Erik Jacobson of SpringHouse Design/Build hung the lattice work and rebuilt the stone walls, Linda Coe found and arranged for the installation of the fountain, Paul Martin provided the electrical work, and Charity and Jim Marlatt, along with other members of the Washbond family, donated the bench. Andrew Derr oversaw the refurbishment. of the shrine facing the garden. Ingrid Carman, Ruth Kuhfahl, Sarah Prince and others have overseen the trimming, weeding and general care of this space.



Memorial and Honoring Stones



One hundred fifty granite stones from a local quarry will be placed in the garden and arranged in a pattern to be chosen by the Task Force. These stones may be purchased and engraved with the name and date of a person you would like to remember or honor. We encourage donations in the range of \$100 - \$250. All funds will go to the perpetual care of the garden.



Committal

The Memorial Garden is designed to receive a small portion of the sifted ashes of a loved one. It is our policy that ashes will be laid to rest with dignity and respect in the presence of one of our clergy. The entire garden is designed as a memorial and is not suitable for individual mementoes and markers. This is in keeping with the motto of the United Church of Christ, "That they may all be one". Names of persons whose ashes are placed in the garden will be recorded in the Memorial Book in the Van Santvoord Room.

Eligibility

Interment in he Memorial Garden is available to members of KVCC and their loved ones and families. The eligibility of others will be determined at the discretion of the Minister or Church Council. Any interment of ashes must be scheduled through the church office whether done with a minister or privately by family or friends

Stewardship and Maintenance

The Congregation is committed to perpetual care and maintenance of the Memorial Garden. Memorial gifts may be made in the name of a loved one to support this commitment and will be recorded in the Memorial Garden Book in the Van Santvoord Room.
